## **Diseases in Timber Regulation 1997**

[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 5 September 1997]

#### 1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Diseases in Timber Regulation 1997*.

#### 2 Definitions

In this regulation—

*approved form* see section 3.

declared disease means a disease declared under section 4.

#### 3 Approval of forms

The chief executive may approve forms for use under the Act.

#### 4 Disease declarations

A disease consisting of the presence of the following organisms is declared to be a disease under the Act—

- (a) Cryptotermes brevis (West Indian drywood termite);
- (b) Ips grandicollis (fivespined bark beetle);
- (c) Sirex noctilio F. (sirex wasp).

#### 5 Infected area declarations

The following areas are declared to be infected areas for the following diseases—

- (a) the part of the State south of latitude 22°45' south and east of longitude 148° east—for fivespined bark beetle;
- (b) the whole of the State—for declared diseases other than fivespined bark beetle.

#### 6 Prohibition for fivespined bark beetle infected area

A person must not remove the following from the infected area declared in section 5(a) without the chief executive's written permission—

- (a) pinus species log with bark on it;
- (b) timber containing pinus bark;
- (c) pinus bark.

#### 7 Measures authorised for infected areas

The taking of measures in an infected area to exterminate, prevent or control the dissemination of the disease the area is declared for is authorised.

#### 8 Declared diseases are notifiable diseases

For section 10(1)¹ of the Act, a declared disease is declared to be a notifiable disease.

#### 9 Prescribed manner for claiming compensation—Act, s 11(1)

- (1) For section 11(1)<sup>2</sup> of the Act, a claim for compensation to the minister must be—
  - (a) in the approved form; and
  - (b) given to the department's office at Brisbane.<sup>3</sup>
- (2) The form under section 2 of the *Diseases in Timber Regulation 1979* is taken to be the approved form until there is an approved form or until this subsection expires, whichever happens first.
- (3) Subsection (2) and this subsection expire 6 months after they commence.

## 10 Repeal

- (1) The subordinate legislation<sup>4</sup> made under the Act, other than this regulation, is repealed.
- (2) This section expires the day after it commences.
