[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 20 September 2002]

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Dental Practitioners Registration Regulation 2001*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 1 January 2002.

PART 2—GENERAL REGISTRATION

3 Qualifications for general registration—Act, s 44

For section 44(1)(a) of the Act, a qualification stated in schedule 1, column 1, and conferred or awarded by the educational institution stated in column 2 for the qualification, is a qualification for general registration.

4 Period of registration—Act, s 56

For section 56(1) of the Act, the general registration period is a financial year.

PART 3—SPECIALIST REGISTRATION

5 Specialties—Act, sch 4, definition “specialty”

For the definition “specialty” in schedule 4 of the Act, a branch of dentistry mentioned in schedule 2, column 1 is a specialty.

6 Qualifications for specialist registration—Act, s 102

(1) For section 102(1)(a)(ii) of the Act, a qualification for specialist registration in a specialty mentioned in schedule 2, column 1 is a qualification stated opposite the specialty in column 2 and conferred or awarded by the educational institution stated for the qualification.

(2) However, for an individual who holds a qualification of Master of Dental Science conferred or awarded by the University of Melbourne or the University of Western Australia, the qualification applies only for the specialty in which the individual undertook the Masters program leading to the qualification.

7 Restricted specialist titles—Act, sch 4, definition “restricted specialist title”

For the definition “restricted specialist title” in schedule 4 of the Act, the restricted specialist title for a specialty mentioned in schedule 2, column 1 is a title that consists of, or includes, the words stated opposite the specialty in column 3.

8 Period of registration—Act, s 109

For section 109(1) of the Act, the specialist registration period is a financial year.

PART 4—FEES

9 Fees

The fees payable under the Act are stated in schedule 3.

10 Waiver of fee—financial hardship

The board may waive, wholly or partly, the payment of a fee by a person if the board is satisfied payment of the fee would cause the person financial hardship.

11 Refund of registration fee or specialist registration fee

(1) The board must refund the registration fee accompanying a person's application for registration, or renewal of registration, if—

- (a) the board refuses to grant the application; or
- (b) the person withdraws the application before it is decided.

(2) Subsection (3) applies if, within 3 months after the board decides to register a person or renew a person's registration, the person surrenders the registration.

(3) The board must refund the registration fee paid by the person less the amount of—

- (a) if the registration is general registration—the registration fee for general registration or special purpose registration for a period of registration of not more than 3 months; or
- (b) if the registration is specialist registration—the registration fee for specialist registration for a period of registration of not more than 3 months.

12 Refund of restoration fee

(1) The board must refund the registration component of a restoration fee accompanying a person's application for restoration of registration if—

- (a) the board refuses to grant the application; or
- (b) the person withdraws the application before it is decided.

(2) Subsection (3) applies if, within 3 months after the board decides to restore a person's registration, the person surrenders the registration.

(3) The board must refund the registration component of the restoration fee paid by the person less the amount of—

- (a) if the registration is general registration—the registration fee for general registration or special purpose registration for a period of registration of not more than 3 months; or

- (b) if the registration is specialist registration—the registration fee for specialist registration for a period of registration of not more than 3 months.

(4) In this section—

“**registration component**”, of a restoration fee, means the amount of the restoration fee less \$75.

PART 5—MISCELLANEOUS

13 Notification of change in circumstances—Act, s 138

For section 138 of the Act, each of the following is a change in a registrant’s circumstances of which the board must be advised—

- (a) a change in the registrant’s name;
- (b) a change in the registrant’s address;
- (c) for a special purpose registrant—a change in the way the registrant undertakes the special activity for which the registrant is registered;

Examples of a ‘change’ for paragraph (c)—

1. A registrant undertakes the activity at a different place.
 2. A registrant changes the amount of time spent doing the activity.
 3. A registrant ceases to do the activity.
- (d) the registrant ceases to be qualified for registration.

14 Prescribed designations and duties of operative dental auxiliaries

(1) For the purposes of section 264(2)(a) of the Act, the prescribed designations of operative dental auxiliaries shall be as follows—

- (a) school dental therapists;
- (b) tutor school dental therapists;
- (c) dental hygienists.

(2) For the purposes of section 264(1) of the Act, the approved courses of training for—

- (a) a school dental therapist shall be—
 - (i) a course of training at a school dental therapists training centre conducted by the Department of Health of the State; or
 - (ii) a course of training, other than that prescribed by subparagraph (i) hereof, approved by the board and the satisfactory completion of such further training as may be directed by the board to be undertaken at a school dental therapists training centre conducted by the Department of Health of the State;
 - (b) a tutor school dental therapist shall be—
 - (i) those courses set out in paragraph (a) (i) and (ii); and
 - (ii) a course of training for tutor school dental therapists at a school dental therapists training centre conducted by the Department of Health of the State;
 - (c) a dental hygienist shall be—
 - (i) a full-time course of training as a dental hygienist at the School of Para Dental Studies, Gillies Plains Community College, South Australia; or
 - (ii) any other course of training as a dental hygienist approved by the board.
- (3) The prescribed duties of—**
- (a) a school dental therapist shall be—
 - (i) established procedures associated with chairside assisting and clinic management; and
 - (ii) dental examination and charting; and
 - (iii) dental radiography for usual dental examination; and
 - (iv) cleaning and polishing of teeth and restorations; and
 - (v) removal of plaque and dental calculus; and
 - (vi) topical application to the teeth of preventive agents and the recommendation of fluoride supplements; and
 - (vii) dental health education; and
 - (viii) application of rubber dam; and

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- (ix) administration of infiltration and inferior dental nerve block analgesia; and
- (x) preparation of cavities in deciduous and permanent teeth but excluding preparations involving pins and inlays; and
- (xi) restoration of deciduous and permanent teeth with amalgam cement or plastic materials; and
- (xii) emergency treatment of pulp exposures in permanent teeth; and
- (xiii) pulp therapy in deciduous teeth; and
- (xiv) forceps extraction of deciduous teeth under local analgesia; and
- (xv) emergency control of haemorrhage; and
- (xvi) application of fissure sealants; and
- (xvii) impressions for study casts; and
- (b) a tutor school dental therapist shall be—
 - (i) the duties of a school dental therapist as set out in paragraph (a); and
 - (ii) assisting in the training of school dental therapists; and
- (c) a dental hygienist shall be—
 - (i) established procedures associated with chairside assistance and practice management; and
 - (ii) oral health education; and
 - (iii) dental radiography for usual dental examination; and
 - (iv) application of rubber dam; and
 - (v) pre-operative and post-operative instruction; and
 - (vi) irrigation of mouth and removal of sutures; and
 - (vii) topical application of solutions prescribed by a registrant; and
 - (viii) removal of dental calculus and dental cement; and
 - (ix) root planing; and
 - (x) cleaning and polishing of teeth and restorations; and

- (xi) impressions for study casts; and
- (xii) removal of periodontal packs; and
- (xiii) band selection; and
- (xiv) removal of ligatures, archwire fixation pins and archwires.

(4) A school dental therapist may perform prescribed duties only—

- (a) as an employee of the department in—
 - (i) a dental clinic established by the department; or
 - (ii) a school dental therapist training centre in Queensland; or
 - (iii) The University of Queensland School of Dentistry; and
- (b) in the treatment of children 4 years of age or older who have not completed year 10 at school.

Maximum penalty—4 penalty units.

(4A) A school dental therapist or a tutor school dental therapist shall not undertake a procedure set out in subsection (3)(a)(xvi) and (xvii) unless the school dental therapist or tutor school dental therapist has been trained to perform the procedure.

Maximum penalty—4 penalty units.

(5) A dental hygienist shall not undertake an operative procedure set out in subsection (3)(c)(iii) to (xiv) unless—

- (a) the dental hygienist has been trained to perform the operative procedure; and
- (b) the procedure does not involve cutting of oral or dental tissue; and
- (c) the procedure has been specifically authorised by a registrant.

Maximum penalty—4 penalty units.

(6) A dental hygienist shall not perform the prescribed duties set out in subsection (3)(c) except under the immediate personal supervision of a registrant.

Maximum penalty—4 penalty units.

(7) A registrant shall not employ a dental hygienist unless the registrant has obtained the prior approval of the board.

Maximum penalty—4 penalty units.

(7A) An application for the approval of the board to employ a dental hygienist shall be made in the approved form and be accompanied by a fee of \$30.00.

(8) A registrant must not, without the board's approval, employ more than 1 dental hygienist at the same time.

Maximum penalty for subsection (8)—5 penalty units.

PART 6—TRANSITIONAL PROVISION

15 Transitional provision about certain existing specialties—Act, s 250

For section 250(6) of the Act, a new specialty mentioned in schedule 4, column 1 includes, or is the equivalent of, the previous specialty stated opposite the new specialty in column 2.
