1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Public Health Amendment Regulation (No. 1) 2015*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 1 January 2016.

3 Regulation amended

This regulation amends the *Public Health Regulation 2005*.

4 Amendment of s 12B (Contagious condition—Act, s 158, definition *contagious condition*)

Section 12B, from ‘mentioned’—

mentioned in schedule 2A, part 1 are contagious conditions.

5 Amendment of s 12D (Vaccine preventable condition—Act, s 158, definition *vaccine preventable condition*)

Section 12D, from ‘mentioned’—

or other medical conditions mentioned in schedule 2B are vaccine preventable conditions.

6 Amendment of s 12E (Prescribed period for a contagious condition—Act, s 160)

(1) Section 12E(1), from ‘part 1’—

part 2 identifies the prescribed period for a contagious condition for a child suspected under chapter 5 of the Act of having the condition.

- (8) Schedule 2A, part 2 as renumbered, column 1, ‘poliomyelitis’—

omit, insert—

poliomyelitis infection

omit, insert—
