1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Casino Control (Supervision Levy) Amendment Regulation 2024*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 21 June 2024.

3 Regulation amended

This regulation amends the *Casino Control Regulation 1999*.

4 Insertion of new s 46D

After section 46C—

insert—

46D Proportion of total amount of supervision levy for casino licensee—Act, s 50B

- (1) This section prescribes, for section 50B(3) of the Act, the proportion of the total levy amount for which a casino licensee for a casino mentioned in table 1 or 2, column 1 is liable.
- (2) For the financial year starting 1 July 2024, the proportion of the total levy amount is stated opposite the casino in table 1, column 2—

Casino	Proportion
Brisbane Casino	7.12%
Cairns Casino	7.66%
Gold Coast casino	42.05%
Queen's Wharf casino	35.62%
Townsville casino	7.55%

- (3) For the financial year starting 1 July 2025 and each later financial year, the proportion of the total levy amount is stated opposite the casino in table 2, column 2—

Column 1	Column 2
Casino	Proportion
Cairns Casino	7.66%
Gold Coast casino	42.05%
Queen's Wharf casino	42.74%
Townsville casino	7.55%

- (4) In this section—

Brisbane Casino see the *Brisbane Casino Agreement Act 1992*, section 2.

Cairns Casino see the *Cairns Casino Agreement Act 1993*, section 2.

Gold Coast casino means the casino to which the agreement mentioned in the *Jupiters Casino Agreement Act 1983*, section 2, relates.

Queen's Wharf casino see the *Queen's Wharf Brisbane Act 2016*, schedule 2.

Townsville casino means the casino to which the agreement mentioned in the *Breakwater Island Casino Agreement Act 1984*, section 2, relates.
