The Parliament of Australia enacts:

1 Short title

This Act is the *Administrative Review Tribunal
(Consequential and Transitional Provisions No.
2) Act 2024*.

2 Commencement

- (1) Each provision of this Act specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.

Part 1—Main amendments

Mutual Recognition Act 1992

16 Paragraphs 34(3)(a) and (b)

Repeal the paragraphs, substitute:

- (a) subject to the *Administrative Review Tribunal Act 2024*, application for review of the decision may be made to the Tribunal by a person whose interests are affected by the decision; and
- (b) a person may, under section 268 of that Act, request a statement of reasons for the decision.
