## General outline

### Short title

*Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Amendment Rule (No. 1) 2012.*

### Authorising law

*Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 2009, section 224*

### Policy objectives and the reasons for them

The Amendment Rule will make minor consequential amendments to the *Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Rules 2009* required as a result of the new national scheme for the registration of business names.

The Amendment Rules will also make a minor technical amendment to Rule 57.

### **Achievement of policy objectives**

The Amendment Rule amends Rules 14-16 and Rule 47 by replacing references to the *Business Names Act 1962* with references to the 'Business Names Register'. The term 'Business Names Register' is defined to mean the register established and maintained under the *Business Names Registration Act 2011* (Cwth).

### **Consistency with policy objectives of authorising law**

The Amendment Rule is consistent with the objectives of the *Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 2009*.

Section 224 of the *Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 2009* provides that the Governor in Council may make rules of court with the consent of the Rules Committee established under the Act.

### **Inconsistency with policy objectives of other legislation**

The Amendment Rule is not inconsistent with the policy objectives of other legislation.

### **Benefits and costs of implementation**

The Amendment Rule will not have any implementation costs.

### **Consistency with fundamental legislative principles**

This Amendment Rule is consistent with fundamental legislative principles.

### **Consultation**

The Rules Committee has consented to the proposed amendments.
