

Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HR Act), I, the Honourable Jackie Trad MP, Deputy Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020* (the Amendment Regulation) made under the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the Amendment Regulation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the HR Act. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the Amendment Regulation is to allow QSuper standard defined benefit category members with a terminal medical condition access to the death benefit that would otherwise become available in the future, and allow QSuper members economically affected by the COVID-19 epidemic limited access to their superannuation in line with recent changes to Commonwealth legislation.

Human Rights Issues

The Amendment Regulation does not affect or engage a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020* is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
