

# Superannuation (State Public Sector) Notice 2021

## Human Rights Certificate

### Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Cameron Dick MP, Treasurer and Minister for Investment provide this human rights certificate with respect to the Superannuation (State Public Sector) Notice 2021 (Notice 2021) made under the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the Notice 2021 is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

### Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Notice 2021 remakes the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Notice 2010* (Notice 2010) to ensure the continuation of existing QSuper membership arrangements of employees of units of the State public sector. The Notice 2021 largely mirrors the Notice 2010 with the exception of various minor amendments, including making a change on request by an employer, removing redundant employer entries, updating the names of various employers, making changes to improve readability and ensure transitional provisions continue to apply as intended, and removing a requirement for the QSuper Board to provide insurance to members as these matters are prescribed in Commonwealth legislation the board must comply with.

### Human Rights Issues

#### Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The Notice 2021 does not impact a human right.

### Conclusion

I consider that the Notice 2021 is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
