

Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022 Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Di Farmer MP, Minister for Employment and Small Business and Minister for Training and Skills Development provides this human rights certificate with respect to the *Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022* made under the *Further Education and Training Act 2014*.

In my opinion, the *Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022*, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The objective of the *Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022* (the Amendment Regulation) is to change the fees prescribed in the *Further Education and Training Regulation 2014* (the Regulation) from being prescribed in dollar amounts to being prescribed in fee units.

The Amendment Regulation will ensure that the *Further Education and Training Regulation 2014* (the Regulation) is compliant with changes to the *Acts Interpretation Act 1954* which took effect on 1 January 2022.

The policy objectives of the Amendment Regulation will be achieved by changing the regulated fees to be prescribed in fee units.

Human Rights Issues

No human rights are identified as being limited by the *Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022*

Conclusion

I consider that the *Further Education and Training (Fee Unit Conversion) Amendment Regulation 2022* is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
