

# **Queensland Veterans' Council (Postponement) Regulation 2022**

## **Human Rights Certificate**

### **Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019***

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for the Olympics provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Queensland Veterans' Council (Postponement) Regulation 2022* made under the *Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021*.

In my opinion, the Regulation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

### **Overview of the Subordinate Legislation**

The *Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021* (the Act) received assent on 4 November 2021 and commences on a date to be fixed by proclamation. The Act provides for the establishment of the Queensland Veterans' Council (Council) to manage Anzac Square, administer the Anzac Day Trust Fund and provide advice to the Minister on veterans' matters.

The *Queensland Veterans' Council (Postponement) Regulation 2022* (Regulation) extends the period before automatic commencement of the uncommenced provisions of the Act, under section 15DA of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1954*, until the end of 4 November 2023.

### **Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)**

As the Regulation is machinery in nature, it does not affect or engage any human rights issues.

### **Consideration of reasonable limitations on human rights (section 13 *Human Rights Act 2019*)**

As the Regulation itself does not raise any human rights issues, it is not necessary to consider section 13 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*.

### **Conclusion**

I consider that the Regulation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise any human rights issues.
