

Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment Notice (No. 2) 2022

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Cameron Dick MP, Treasurer and Minister for Investment provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment Notice (No. 2) 2022* (Amendment Notice) made under the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the Amendment Notice is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the Amendment Notice is to address requests from various employers to amend the superannuation arrangements offered to their employees either to bring it in line with current arrangements; allow access to additional membership categories within the Government Division of Australian Retirement Trust; or allow the continuation of the existing superannuation arrangements for transferring employees. It also prescribes the arrangements for employees of two new units of the State public sector.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The Amendment Notice does not impact a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the Amendment Notice is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
