

Proclamation No. 1 – *Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023*

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Scott Stewart MP, Minister for Resources provide this human rights certificate with respect to the Proclamation made under the *Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023*.

In my opinion, the Proclamation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

This Proclamation fixes the date of commencement for stock route fee related provisions of the *Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023* (Amendment Act), which amends the *Stock Route Management Act 2002* (Stock Route Management Act).

These provisions enable the introduction of a new application fee for stock route travel and agistment permits as well as local governments retaining all revenue generated from application fees, permit fees, water facility agreements, and fines.

This Proclamation fixes 1 July 2023 as the date of commencement of the following provisions of the Amendment Act—

- section 63(2) and (3)
- section 64
- section 65
- section 67, to the extent it inserts section 187B(1)(a)
- section 69, to the extent it inserts section 340
- schedule 1, amendment of Stock Route Management Act, amendment 4.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The Proclamation does not affect or engage a human right.

Human rights engaged by the *Stock Route Management Regulation 2023* more generally were assessed and included in the Human Rights Statement of Compatibility for the Land and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2022.

A comprehensive analysis of human right considerations relating to stock route fees is also addressed in the human rights certificate for the *Stock Route Management Regulation 2023*.

Conclusion

I consider that the Proclamation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not limit human rights.
