Proclamation No. 2 – Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the Human Rights Act 2019

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Scott Stewart MP, Minister for Resources provide this human rights certificate with respect to the Proclamation made under the *Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023*.

In my opinion, the Proclamation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

This Proclamation fixes 3 July 2023 as the date of commencement of sections 79, 81, 83 and 86 of the *Land and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2023*. These sections amend the *Survey and Mapping Infrastructure Act 2003* (SMI Act).

The amendments omit certain technical and procedural surveying requirements from the SMI Act, to be replaced by survey standards made under section 6 of the SMI Act by the Chief Executive of the Department of Resources. Replacing legislative requirements with survey standards allows greater flexibility and efficiency to update the technical and procedural requirements for surveying practice as necessary.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The Proclamation does not affect or engage a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the Proclamation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not limit human rights.
