

Legal Profession (Society Rules) Amendment Notice 2024

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Yvette D’Ath MP, Attorney-General and Minister for Justice and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence, provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Legal Profession (Society Rules) Amendment Notice 2024* (Notice) made under section 697 of the *Legal Profession Act 2007*.

In my opinion, the Notice, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the Notice is to give notice of the making of the Legal Profession (Society) Amendment Rule (No.1) 2024 (Amendment Rule) by the Queensland Law Society Council.

The Amendment Rule amends the Legal Profession (Society) Rules 2007 to provide that the rates of annual subscription are payable in accordance with the Queensland Law Society Administration Rule 2005.

Human Rights Issues

The Notice does not affect or engage any human rights.

Conclusion

I consider that the Notice is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
