

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HR Act), I, Grace Grace MP, Minister for State Development and Infrastructure, Minister for Industrial Relations and Minister for Racing, provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024* made under the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Act 2003*.

In my opinion, the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024*, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the HR Act. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

Each year workers' compensation entitlements are indexed in accordance with Queensland Ordinary Time Earnings (QOTE) to ensure the relative value of entitlements over time.

The purpose of the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024* is to notify the amount of QOTE for the 2024-25 financial year and the percentage difference in QOTE compared to the previous financial year.

Human Rights Issues

The *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024* applies an existing legislated indexation to entitlement amounts and does not limit or engage a human right.

Conclusion

I consider the *Workers' Compensation Rehabilitation (QOTE) Notice 2024* is compatible with the HR Act because it does not raise a human rights issue.
