

Police Service Administration Amendment Regulation 2024

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Mark Ryan MP, Minister for Police and Community Safety provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Police Service Administration Amendment Regulation 2024* (Amendment Regulation) made under the *Police Service Administration Act 1990* (Act).

In my opinion, the Amendment Regulation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Act provides for the administration of the Queensland Police Service (QPS) and authorises the making of regulations about the management and control of the affairs of the QPS.

The objective of the Amendment Regulation is to ensure the QPS is compliant with the statutory framework regulating its endorsement as a deductible gift recipient.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

No human rights have been identified as being engaged or limited by the Amendment Regulation. The Amendment Regulation does not raise any human rights issues.

Consideration of reasonable limitations on human rights (section 13 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

No human rights have been identified as being engaged or limited by the Amendment Regulation.

Conclusion

I consider that the Amendment Regulation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
