Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

Pursuant to section 14(3) of the *Professional Standards Act 2004*, a scheme is not subordinate legislation, and therefore this human rights certificate does not contemplate the scheme notified by the Notice.

Human Rights Issues

The Notice does not affect or engage a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the Notice is compatible with the HR Act because it does not raise a human rights issue.
